METHODOLOGY

An online survey of 1,000 currently enrolled college students in the U.S. (500) and Canada (500)

Methodological Notes:

The VitalSource Survey was conducted by Wakefield Research (<u>www.wakefieldresearch.com</u>) among 1,000 currently enrolled college students in the US (500) and Canada (500), between May 18 and May 25, 2018, using an email invitation and an online survey.

Results of any sample are subject to sampling variation. The magnitude of the variation is measurable and is affected by the number of interviews and the level of the percentages expressing the results. For the interviews conducted in this particular study, the chances are 95 in 100 that a survey result does not vary, plus or minus, by more than 4.4 percentage points for each of the American and Canadian samples from the result that would be obtained if interviews had been conducted with all persons in the universe represented by the sample.
