#### **METHODOLOGY**

An online survey of 1,000 currently enrolled college students in the US (500) and Canada (500)

### **Methodological Notes**:

The VitalSource Survey was conducted by Wakefield Research (<a href="www.wakefieldresearch.com">www.wakefieldresearch.com</a>) among 500 currently enrolled college students in the US, and 500 currently enrolled college students in Canada between May 8 and May 17, 2017, using an email invitation and an online survey. Quotas have been set to ensure reliable and accurate representation of Americans currently enrolled in college.

Results of any sample are subject to sampling variation. The magnitude of the variation is measurable and is affected by the number of interviews and the level of the percentages expressing the results. For the interviews conducted in this particular study, the chances are 95 in 100 that a survey result does not vary, plus or minus, by more than 4.4 percentage points in each country from the result that would be obtained if interviews had been conducted with all persons in the universe represented by the sample.
